The daycare provides a dedicated space for early childhood development, while the housing units offer much-needed homes for families

Work is underway on the new 6-plex unit for Little Salmon Carmacks First Nation. Lot preparation is in progress, with concrete footings set to be poured soon. As framing begins, we will be looking for workers to support the next phase of construction.

Hotel Carmacks

Hotel Carmacks continues to grow and improve, with several exciting upgrades underway. A full-time front desk staff has been in place since February 1, 2025, providing a more personalized experience for guests. For those who prefer convenience, an automated check-in system is also available.

The restaurant has seen major improvements, with newly hired cooks, a refreshed menu featuring weekly specials, and upgrades including new tables, chairs, and an oven range—all aimed at enhancing the overall dining experience.

These efforts reflect a continued commitment to providing quality hospitality and ensuring a welcoming stay for all guests.

Sunrise Service Centre

Carmacks Development Corporation is taking steps to secure the future of the Sunrise Service Centre. We plan to turn it into the Nä Kų Trading Post, a place where local Indigenous artists can sell their art and crafts. This will help the community by providing a space to share and celebrate their culture. Additionally, the Nä Kų Trading Post will offer coffee, tea, and healthy snacks, paying homage to the traditional trading posts of the past.









Quarry Development

Carmacks Development Corporation is advancing its quarry project to provide essential aggregate materials such as crush, sand, pit run, and topsoil to the Village of Carmacks and Northern Tutchone communities. With positive aggregate testing results, CDC is progressing through the final stages of the environmental review. Once approved, this initiative will support local infrastructure and development.

Mt. Nansen Remediation

Carmacks Development Corporation continues to expand its role in the Mt. Nansen Remediation project. After successfully bidding on part of the mill demolition, we have now been awarded the abatement of the mill.

Separately, we also completed a smaller bid for septic field upgrades. We remain committed to staying

involved in the remediation process and actively seeking opportunities to provide training and capacity-building initiatives for LSCFN citizens, ensuring long-term participation in environmental restoration efforts.

Community Training Initiatives

Carmacks Development Corporation provides training opportunities to LSCFN and Northern Tutchone citizens. This initiative aims to equip community members with valuable skills and work experience, supporting their involvement in various projects.

LSCFN Greenhouse Construction

Carmacks Development Corporation is excited to announce that the greenhouse for the Little Salmon Carmacks First Nation is in its final stages of construction. This project will boost local food production and enhance food security for LSCFN citizens.
